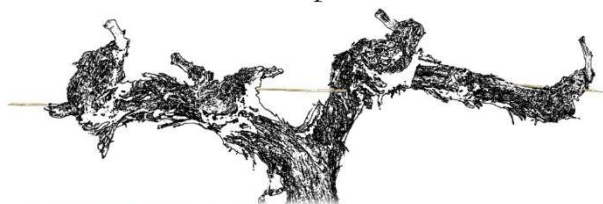




LES CLANS

CÔTES DE PROVENCE 2013

Grapes are selected from vines that grow from parcels of superior quality. The best quality lots bearing old vines consisting primarily of Grenache and Rolle (Vermentino). Harvesting at sunrise to noon. Optical grape sorting. Destemming and slight crushing at 7-8°C to avoid oxidation. 90% free run juice. 10% first slight pressing. No maceration. Alcoholic fermentation in new and second year demi-muids (600 L barrels). 10 months burgundian style «Bâtonnage» twice weekly. Individual barrel temperature control.

Salmon pink with a hint of orange. Fresh, elegant and refined with lovely texture to the pear, spice and toast flavours. Quite warm and seamless with faint hints of cherries and strawberries, but this isn't particularly fruit driven. Sophisticated but not intrusive barrel ferment characters, as well as fine fennel and herb notes. It's quite hard to describe, because this isn't a typical rosé, but it's beautiful. **Jamie Goode**

Rosé wine with a classically pale colour, just a hint of onion skin, copper. The nose is showing a hint of oak, there's quite ripe fruit in there, ripe pear, quince, red berries and some floral notes. Very good grip on the palate... quite full-bodied style, with a good deal of freshness, well-maintained acidity. Flavour wise it's leading more towards the structure of a good white wine, almost like white Burgundy texture, a slight hint of oakiness. More than a rosé d'apéritif it's gastronomic. **Markus Del Monego**

Creamy and alluring, with gorgeous mango, peach, papaya and white cherry fruit flavors. Honeysuckle, macadamia and brioche hints fill in on the finish. Close your eyes and you'd think this was a Marsanne from the Rhône. Drink now through 2016. 1,500 cases made. -JM

Decanter

Fragrant, lingering and intricate, with honeyed oak and sweet berry fruit on the nose. Glorious substance and depth, this is mellow but intense, with expressive, nutty fruit, peach nougatine and a long finish. This really pushes the boundaries of rose in terms of concentration and allusiveness.
